### Bougainville Conflict (1987 - 1998)

The conflict on Bougainville, an island under the jurisdiction of Papua New Guinea (PNG), began in 1987 as a dispute over compensation for the use of land by Bougainville Copper Ltd, a an Australian subsidiary. The underlying issue of independence soon emerged and the conflict escalated between the government of PNG and the native islanders, in turn spearheaded by the Bougainville Revolutionary Army (BRA). Until fighting ended in 1998, an estimated 20,000 died in the conflict. Several pre-negotiation agreements culminated in an agreement to a 'permanent and irrevocable' ceasefire, and a framework for normalizing the PNG-Bourgainville relationship, which included elections.

It details the procedure for tabling the referendum results in Parliament, with a commitment to implementing the referendum's conclusions between 2025 and 2027. Furthermore, the Covenant stipulates joint formulation of a report to Parliament and acknowledges the binding nature of international agreements, emphasizing adherence to internationally recognized human

rights conventions.

### Self determination Article 2 - Timeframe

(i) The Parties reaffirm their solemn commitment to strengthening the implementation of the Agreement and where appropriate, all outcomes of the joint post-referendum consultations, bearing in mind the Referendum Results Implementation Roadmap (Wabag Roadmap') that requires:

(a) implementation of arrangements for independence/political settlement by no earlier than 2025 and no later than 2027;

and

(b) reporting to the 11th Parliament, tabling of the Referendum Results and outcomes of the joint post-referendum consultations by not later than the end of 2023.
