Amongst other things, it commits the Government to provide a special fund for victims, out of which reparations will be paid, develop and implement a strategy for assisting the return and resettlements of IDPs and recovery programmes in affected areas, and appoint an Equal Opportunities Commission that shall work to address, inter alia, the regional and ethnic imbalances and disparities in participation in Government departments and institutions.
