Description

In this short agreement, Chadian authorities state their support to all Chadians, including members of the Popular Front for Recovery (PFR). In return, the PFR representatives accept the authority of the Chadian president, renounce to all acts of aggression and commits to gain support from all members of their movements to the ongoing peace process. All parties reject any access to power that is not by elections and do not tolerate the presence of politico-military movements that harm the other on their territory. It includes a ceasefire agreement by the FPR and the aim to come to a peace agreement at their next meeting.
