Process type      Formal structured process

Rationale	This agreement was concluded with the support of the Federal Government of Somalia (FGS) which is also responsible for ensuring the implementation and success of the agreement (p. 3). An IGAD representative signed the agreement as a witness, and the AU, EU, and UN signed as observers. The FGS mediated a similar agreement between the Mudug and Galgaduud regions about a month later (see Central Regions State Formation Agreement (Mudug and Galgadug), 30/07/2014).
Is there a documented link to a national peace process?	Yes
Link to national process: articulated rationale	The agreement is part of a wider political settlement process in Somalia that aimed at establishing inclusive regional administrations. The agreement refers to the Addis Ababa Agreement, 27/08/2013, which established the Interim Jubba Administration (p.1).
