Letter dated 7 May 1991 from the Permanent Representative of Guatemala to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

I have the honour to transmit herewith the Agreement on a general agenda, signed at Mexico City on 26 April 1991 following talks held by the delegations of the Government of Guatemala and the Unidad Revolucionaria Nacional Guatemalteca (URNG) in the presence of Guatemala's National Reconciliation Commission and the Observer appointed by you (see annex).

The Agreement on a general agenda was signed as a result of the Government's commitment to put an end to the internal armed conflict and bring about reconciliation among all Guatemalans (see also document A/45/1007-S/22563).

I should be grateful if you would have this letter and its annex circulated as a document of the General Assembly, under agenda item 28, and of the Security Council.

- 1. Democratization. Human rights.
- 2. Strengthening of civilian authority and the role of the army in a democratic society.
- 3. Identity and rights of indigenous peoples.
- 4. Constitutional reforms and electoral system.
- 5. Socio-economic aspects.
- 6. Agrarian situation.
- 7. Resettlement of populations uprooted by the armed conflict.
- 8. Bases for bringing URNG into the political life of the country.
- 9. Arrangements for the final cease-fire.
- 10. Timetable for the implementation, fulfilment and verification of agreements.
- 11. Signing of the agreement on a firm and lasting peace, and demobilization.
